










### COVID-19 IMPACTS ON ONTARIO'S SOCIAL SERVICE NONPROFITS



Almost three quarters have reduced revenue from fundraising



One fifth can only sustain their organizations for about 1-2 months



Over 90% have experienced or anticipate a disruption in services to clients & community

### COVID-19 IMPACTS ON ONTARIO'S SOCIAL SERVICE NONPROFITS

- 91% Have experienced or anticipate a disruption in service to clients and community
- 72% See a decline in their revenues from fundraising

#### Financial forecast and impact

- 1. 20 per cent can only sustain their organizations for about 1-2 months
- 2. 22 per cent indicated that the impact from COVID-19 would be \$100,000 to \$249,999




### COVID-19 IMPACTS ON ONTARIO'S EDUCATION & RESEARCH NONPROFITS



Almost half have laid off or will have to lay off staff



One third can sustain their organizations for only about 1-2 months



More than a quarter have experienced closures

### COVID-19 IMPACTS ON EDUCATION AND RESEARCH NONPROFITS

- 48% Have laid off or will have to lay off staff
- 31% Have sustained increased staff and volunteer absences
- 28% Have experienced closures

#### Financial forecast and impact

- 1. 35 per cent can sustain their organizations for only about 1-2 months
- 2. 29 per cent indicated the financial impact would be between \$100,000 to \$249,999.





# COVID-19 IMPACTS ON ONTARIO'S ARTS AND CULTURE NONPROFITS

- 82% Have reported reduced revenues from earned income and fundraising at the same level.
- 40% Have had to close their doors until further notice
- Remain open with changes to how they go about their normal operations

#### Financial forecast and impact

- 1.32 per cent indicated they would need between \$50,000 and \$99,999
- 2. Approximately one-quarter say they would need less than \$50,000



# COVID-19 IMPACTS ON ONTARIO'S HEALTH NONPROFITS







75% have reduced revenues and 31% can only sustain their organization for about 3-6 months

Two fifths estimate the impact to be between \$100,000 and \$499,999 83% have experienced a disruption of services to clients and communities

Nonprofits are the foundation of resilient communities and a dynamic province.







### COVID-19 IMPACTS ON ONTARIO'S HEALTH NONPROFITS

- 75% Have reduced revenues
- 88% Have had to change events from in-person to virtual
- 83% Have experienced a disruption of services to clients and communities.
- 79% Have had challenges related to staff and volunteers needing to do remote work

#### Financial forecast and impact

- 1. 19 per cent would need less than \$50,000
- 2. 42 per cent estimated the impact to be between \$100,000 and \$499,999
- 3. 31 per cent can sustain their organizations for only about **3-6 months**


